READ THE RECEIPT

That's the number that matters: **under 2 minutes** from alert to confirmed reservation. The slot was there, the alert fired, the rest was clicking.

RUNNING IN PARALLEL

Competitors watching the same window during the catch did not fire. Faster checks and an immediate alert are the whole difference for a place like this.

🕒 WHAT ACTUALLY HAPPENED

A script that checked every 90 seconds.

Disney releases reservations at 6 AM Eastern, and the best tables at the most sought-after spots vanish to the people already awake, already watching, already refreshing. Most families aren't doing that.

In April 2026, the founder's family wanted a Mother's Day brunch at the Cake Bake Shop. The 60-day window opened, no availability. It had already been snapped up.

The normal path from there is: check back manually, hope for a cancellation, probably miss it. Instead, he wrote a script that checked the Disney availability endpoint automatically. Not once an hour. Every 90 seconds.

Over the next 52 hours it fired 2,395 checks. On a Friday afternoon around 4:51 PM, a slot opened. The alert fired. He booked it on Disney's official site. That brunch happened.

Independent, alert-only service. Not affiliated with Disney. SpotSitter sends an alert when availability appears; you complete the booking yourself on Disney's official site with your own credentials. One catch does not predict the next. Availability is controlled entirely by Disney.
